Parking Rules

It appears that we need to remind all our residents and their guests of the parking rules in effect in Barron Square:

- Residents/Owners are NOT permitted to park in designated VISITOR spaces.
- There is no parking allowed in designated fire zones (RED curb or sign).
- Violators are subject to towing by the Association or the City of Palo Alto.
- Each resident/owner has one assigned outside space in the parking area.
- Please do not allow guests or contractors to park in a neighbor's space.
- Violators are subject to towing by request of the respective Owner.

Thain Way is a public street and has limited spaces. If you are parking on the street, please be considerate and pull your car forward to maximize the number of spaces.

The City of Palo Alto enforces parking on Thain Way. Any vehicle parked in the same place more than 72 hours is considered abandoned and may be ticketed and towed by the City. If

you observe a vehicle parked on Thain Way for more than 72 hours, you may call the Abandoned Vehicle Hotline (650-329-2258) 24-hours and leave a voice mail message. Have available a description of the vehicle, location, license number and how long it has been parked. You can also report these on line at
